Dear Sir:

This is to advise that, following my visit with you to your Ballarat property in Boulder county, this state, I had two samples of the highgrade streak lying on the footwall side, assayed for GOLD by Wilfley & Bribach, who do my regular work. The results are as follows:

Sample No. 1. Black, amorphous material.  
Gold, ----- 374.6 ozs/ton.

Sample No. 2. Lead-gray telluride in vuggy quartz.  
Gold, ----- 133.7 ozs/ton.

Altho not run for SILVER, the assayer noted that the samples carried a considerable amount of that metal.

Even tho the streak was small and apparently of good grade, I was unprepared for such high results.

Altho the project must be considered, in its present stage as nothing more than a prospect, it nevertheless, must be regarded as a promising one; the assays indicated above, the general appearance and size of the vein, and its proximity and similarity to other producing veins of the district, render it well worthy of serious consideration.

I am of the opinion that you are fully justified in continuing its development, both laterally and to greater depth.
