URANIUM and WOLFRAMITE.

I have the honor to report that I produced of the precious metals during the year 1900, as follows:

URANIUM.

Montrose County, 15 tons (carnotite) average 10% uranium oxide.

WOLFRAMITE.

San Juan County, 3 tons concentrates assaying 68% tungstic acid.

Boulder County, 40 tons concentrates averaging 65% tungstic acid.

The production of tungsten ores in Colorado will be at least 100 % more next year.
