THE NICKERBOCKER TUNNEL

The Nickerbocker tunnel, starting in Dry Gulch, Clear Creek County and terminating at the Gem Extension, a distance of about six thousand (6,000) feet, pursues an East and West course and runs with the Defender vein. The Defender vein is practically the Crown Point and they have been opened on the surface for a distance of six (6) miles. The Company has three thousand (3,000) feet of ground on the length of the tunnel site. At a distance of about thirty-five hundred (3500) feet from the tunnel mouth, the tunnel will cut through the Crown Point vein at a depth of 700 feet. The following paying mines will be cut by the tunnel in its course: The Defender, Glennig, Clogan, Lucia, Asteroid, Phoenix, Golden Cloud, President Hayes, White Cloud and Columbia; some of which are owned by the Company the the remainder are under lease and bond to them. The Crown Point owns five hundred (500) feet of the vein west and the Tunnel Company owns three thousand (3000) feet of the same vein. This tunnel does not take the form of a cross-cut, but that of a tunnel on the vein. The tunnel is started on the Defender vein and the first property of any note that is cut is the John L. Emerson at a depth of seven hundred and fifty (750) ft., the next is the Crown Point at a depth of seven hundred (700) feet, and the next the Bantella at a depth of five hundred (500) feet. The tunnel, running to its objective point, encounters its course the best gold and silver bearing leads in Clear Creek County. The tunnel is in one hundred (100) ft. in length and operations are continued daily. It is proposed to drive the tunnel by hand. The Tunnel is capitalized for \$2,500,000, 2,500,000 shares at \$1.00 per share, 750,000 shares remain in the treasury. The following men constitute the officers of the company: A. C. Josephi, President, George W. Lane, Secretary. Their office is located in the Boston Building, Denver.

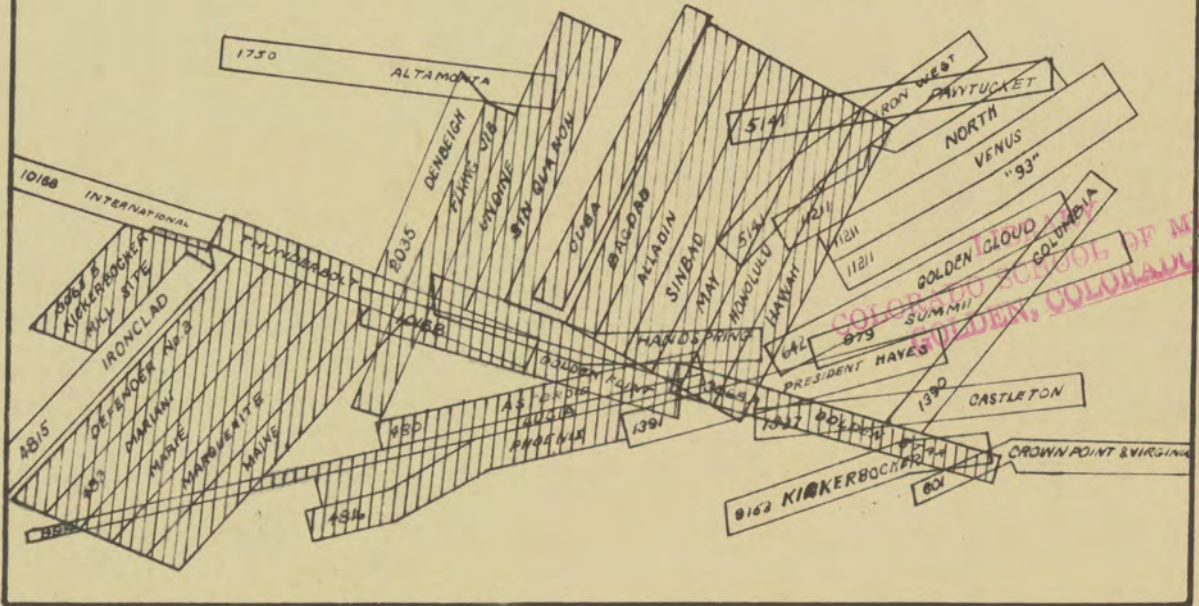
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MAP
