Your favors of May 2d and 5th at hand and I am pleased to learn that you have a revival which may develop into a mining boom in the near future.

We will have our demonstrating plant ready for operation about June 1st. As we already have a large number of tests booked, I believe it would be better to delay your tests until later, as one of our field engineers will probably visit your camp in the near future and arrange for samples. It might help us in deciding this matter if you could mail us some small one or two pound average samples of what would your milling ore.

The parties Mrs. Glenn referred to have not arrived from the East and I have advised from then that they will probably be delayed for another 30 days. As soon as they arrive will try and interest them in your proposition.

We will keep you posted on the development of our Denver Plant and when we are in town we would be pleased to have you visit our office and also the new demonstrating plant.
