SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT, JULY 8th, 1901.

To the President and Board of Directors of The Elkton Consolidated Mining and Milling Company,

Gentlemen:

The past year has been a most prosperous one for the mine. In that time it has produced 19,080 net tons, of the average gross value of \$60.33 per ton.

We have run drifts and cross-cuts as follows:

and upraises 165 linear feet, a total development of 4,812 linear feet as against 2,217 linear feet during the previous year.

We have stoped out during the year as follows:

A total of 14,800 square yards as against 9,944 square yards during the previous year; thus while only taking out 1-3 more ore the production was almost double.

We have enlarged the shaft from the 400 foot level to the surface, thus making it three compartments, with two double deck cages.

On account of the various improvements and mishaps spoken of above, we have done very little work on the newly acquired properties.

On the Tornado we have a small force stoping on the upper levels, and doing a little development, the shaft having been sunk 134 feet, but on the Raven the only work is being done by lessees, in the old workings.

For the same reason the ore shipped during the past year has been principally of a smelting grade, but we have large reserves of mill ore standing in the various levels which, with our increased facilities for economic handling, we hope to ship during the coming year.

In drifting south on the 700 foot level we encountered a new 5 foot vein of \$50.00 ore, just east of the main, which gives every indication of being valuable, but on account of the water we have been unable to explore it for any great distance.

We have only drifted far enough on the 8th level to prove its value, and on the 7th level north the ore is of high grade and the vein is wider and better than was ever before encountered in the mine.

With our present equipment we are prepared to handle a very large amount of ore at a reduced cost, and I feel safe in saying that the coming year will be most prosperous in the history of the mine.
