New: AWM/MfA Essay Contest



To increase awareness of women's ongoing contributions to mathematics, the Association for Women in Mathematics and Math for America are cosponsoring an essay contest for biographies based on interviews of women working in or retired from mathematical careers. The contest is open to students in **Grades 6–8, Grades 9–12, and Undergraduate**.

The Association for Women in Mathematics and Math for America cosponsor an essay contest each year for students in three categories: Grades 6-8, Grades 9-12, and Undergraduate. Contestants interview a woman in a mathematical career about her life and work, and then they write and submit a short biographical essay based on their interview (500-1000 words).
